



INTRODUCTION

For several years, during at least three decades, I have been engaged in researching my family history. Of special interest has been the Matson family of East Kent whose members contributed widely to the development of the area. Members of the family have been discovered in many parts of the world and their occupations are as varied as the characters that make up the history.

Although this work shows events and dates, I have also endeavoured to provide some insight into the people and their lives and have included brief notes and illustrations where that information was available.

The Matson Coat of Arms used here is based on the description given by Edward Hasted in his "The History and Topographical Survey of the County of Kent" published in 1800 and "The British Herald Cabinet of Armorial Bearings" by Thomas Robson, published in 1850. Where an individual is shown with the Coat of Arms, it purely indicates that they are members of my own direct ancestry.

Since 1538, clergy of the Church of England and in Wales have kept registers of church baptisms, marriages and burials. Where possible I have shown the date of birth and the date of baptism,



however sources may have given the date and place of baptism as the date and place of birth. Civil registration of births, marriages and deaths began in England and Wales on the 1st July 1837. Copies of the register entries are kept by the Office for National Statistics and have been indexed. The indexes are organised alphabetically for each year in quarterly volumes to 1983.

Where I have not identified precise records for an event, I have included the quarter, year, registration district and reference from the indexes. An entry may therefore show a date such as *Jun 1845 Dover Registration District 1a 1234*. This does <u>not</u> mean that the event necessarily took place in the month of June 1845 or in Dover. It purely indicates that the event was <u>registered</u> in the period April/May/June 1845 and that the registration is within the Dover Registration District.

I would like to put on record my sincere thanks to all those responsible for making records available. The information comes from approximately 300 different sources (some outside the United Kingdom), including Canterbury Cathedral, The Kent County Council Archives, The National Archives, Churches, Cemeteries, Libraries, Museums and Parish Registers and, of course, that invaluable 21st Century source – The World Wide Web.

I wish to thank those other researchers who have also given time, advice and information – especially Linda Foreman (Surrey), Dawn Dyson (New Zealand), Betty Matson (Essex), and Maggie Fletcher – Nee Matson (Tasmania).

No document about the Matson Family would be complete without acknowledging the work of Major Colin Matson, who in 1962 published his "Domestic Pilgrimage – A story of the Matson Family". My great-grandmother Lucy Matson (nee Hills) both met and corresponded with Major Colin and assisted in his work. Major Colin's wife Dorothy produced the illustration on page two of this document and his "Domestic Pilgrimage" has been a real inspiration to me.

As with all research, it is difficult to know when to stop! There is always the prospect of discovering something new, of finding that 'missing link' or the concern at having missed an important fact.

I have produced this Version 3 of the document first issued in April 2009, as information about a further branch of the Matsons, descended from Henry Matson of Wingham (1823-1892) and his wife Lucy Elizabeth Dodd, came to light just as I was in the process of distribution. As there are several branches of the family in the Antipodes and this research is being deposited as a resource in both Australia and New Zealand, I felt it was important to also include the recently discovered branch. I have also taken the opportunity to add some further illustrations and maps, which I hope, will assist the reader, together with some minor additions/corrections to entries.

I have records of other Matson people, discovered, but for the moment, unlinked to those covered here. There are certainly Matsons from Kent who went to North America and this is one such family whose earlier origins I have been unable to trace -

John Matson, a Mariner/Fisherman from Milton had a son, John Bridge Matson, christened 16th March 1835 at Upchurch, Isle of Sheppey, married Emma Matilda Williams on the 24th December 1859 at Sittingbourne. The couple had ten children. The sixth child, John, was born in 1869 and died in 1870 in Sittingbourne. The couple's next child, Frederick John, was christened in Toronto in The Dominion of Canada on the 14th July 1873. In the 1851 census, John records his occupation as a Lamplighter. In Toronto John became a building Contractor.

Whilst I have made every effort to ensure the accuracy of my research, this document must <u>not</u> be taken as a statement of fact. It should certainly <u>not</u> be taken as proof of any hereditary links.

Each person has a number preceding his or her name. The number inside parentheses represents the number of generations between the source couple and a descendant. Thus, the number (4) 1.3.2.5 means that the person is the 4th Generation and 5th child of the 2nd child of the 3rd child of the 1st of the source couple. Descendants with more than one spouse have a lowercase alphabet letter suffix for each of their marriages. For all succeeding generations, you can trace descendants to the correct ancestor by the letter suffix. Put another way, you can tell which ancestor's marriage produced which descendants by looking at the letter in the number.

Textual notes/quotations throughout the document are often opinions and views made by individuals either at the time of the events, or with the benefit of historical hindsight. These notes are given to aid in gaining a picture of the lives of the people concerned and, I hope, to add some glimpses into the world as it was at the time. The text is extracted from my research notes and should <u>not</u> be interpreted as fact.

I apologise for any errors or omissions that have been made.





Parishes of East Kent





The reign of Henry V1 (1422-1461) of the House of Lancaster.

The name Matson, in various forms, appears all over Scandinavia and Germany, but Matson seems specific to Denmark and Schleswig-Holstein, besides some families in Scotland and southeast England.



As Sandwich was a busy port at this time, with wellestablished trading links, it seems very probable that our earliest Matson was a sailor or merchant who possibly came from Scandinavia and settled in the port town. There is a constant thread of maritime connection that runs through the members of the Matson family included in this document; including those adventurers who traveled and settled in the colonies and far reaches of the globe.



Probably born in the reign of Henry V1. He died in the reign of Henry V11.

Will dated 13th January 1500-1 Probate 23rd March 1501-2 Robert the Mariner died in 1500; so, it can be assumed that he was born in the first half of the 15th century. Under the terms of his will, he left specific bequests for "the repair of the Tower and upkeep of the High Altar of the "Church of St. Clement" - who, incidentally, was the patron saint of mariners. Both these parts of this interesting old church are in excellent order at the present day. Matson the Mariner's Will, to reparation of the tower of St Clement's Sandwich 2 shillings. (I have more details of this Will from the Sandwich Archives but have not proved he is an ancestor). I'm afraid I don't know which Robert this refers to - Robert Matson, will proved, or he died (not clear which),

We also have a partial transcription of the later will of this son John Matson, Mariner of Sandwich 13 Nov 1551, mentioning sons Nicholas and James not yet 16 and probable daughters Elizabeth and Ann not yet 21. Therefore, it is just possible that this is our earliest James 1550-1593 but Major Colin said he could find no proof. These are before the days of parish records.

This is from "Domestic Pilgrimage" written by Major Colin Matson: -

The earliest record of a Matson in Kent is that of Robert of Sandwich, Mariner, who died in 1500. This will, in difficult Old English, has been examined at the County Archives at Maidstone, and as abstract was taken. Certain items were as follows:

- 2 shillings for repairs to the tower of St Clements Church, Sandwich.

- 1 shilling for upkeep of the high altar.

- Money to the Carmelite Brothers for 13 masses.

- Wish to be buried in the chancel of St Clements.

- Mention of wife Joan and son John and appointment of Simon Ball as guardian of son John until the age of 14 years.

No record of any later descendants has been noted. Nor is any trace of association with the Direct Line to be found. Saint Clement was the patron of mariners, and the church dedicated to him is now the one parish church in Sandwich. We can consider the above-named Robert as living in the middle years of the 15th century - so that our collection of records extends over a period of 500 years.

John Matson is recorded in the Chantry of Nicholas Burton. The founder was a wealthy merchant of Sandwich who died in 1494 and was buried in the nave of the church of St. George, between the Chapels of St. James the Apostle and the Chapel of St. Margaret. "... the profits coming from all those lands and tenements of his given for the support of one Perpetual Chantry in the same church". (Canterbury C. Wills, Vol 3, f.368).

The details (Kent No.28 [51] 1548) record that in 1548, the Chantry called "Burtons Chauntry" in the Parish of St. Clement, Sandwiche included "Land now in tenure of John Matson, at will yearly".

The Chantry was sold on the 12th February 1549 to Thomas Horton of Iford, Wilts, esquire and Richard Bylett of Cossam, Wilts, gent (with other lands). Details given include "the lands in the several tenures of … John Matson…. all in the Parish of St. Clement and else where in Kent which belonged to Burtons Chantry and all other possessions of the same. Except bells and leaden roofs of the Chantry."

James lived at Sibertswold (Shepherdswell).

Please note that either her father's date of birth or Alice's is inaccurate as her father would have been aged only 10 when Alice was born.

In the Calendar of Assize Records 1595, there is an entry as follows: -

"2343. Spyre, Daniel, of Sibertswold, labourer, indicted for grand larceny. On 29th August 1595, he broke into the house of Alice Matson, widow, at Sibertswold and stole £17 in money from a chest. (Badly damaged). Confessed; allowed clergy."

In July 1596, there is a further entry: -

"2365. Spyre, Daniel, of Sturry, labourer, indicted for grand larceny. On 2nd May 1596 at Stelling, he stole a pair of sheets (10s.), 4 bands (13s.4d.), 2 neckerchiefs (6s.8d), a pair of stockings (2s.), 2 shirts (2s.6d.) and 56s.8d. in money from Robert Betts. (R.F.). Guilty; to hang."

The link to parents Thomas and Elizabeth Franklyne is 'best guess' only and unconfirmed.

Robert might be a son of Thomas Matson & Elizabeth Franklyn. They started in Shepherdswell and wandered through Dover and into Sellindge. Thomas died in 1629 so his wife would have been a widow in 1635. Only problem is I haven't got a baptism for a Robert around 1613. Thomas and Elizabeth were in Dover in 1609 and then pop up in Sellindge in 1614 so there is a five-year gap where I lose track of them. There could easily have been more children between 1609 and 1614.

Various names are repeated on certain of the MATSON lines; Robert and James are core family names. Christopher is important on my line. An oddity is Nathaniel who was one of the rich Dover merchant Matsons; the only other MATSON with this name that I have seen was one born to my John MATSON & Elizabeth FOADE in 1694. Perhaps this indicates that this John was closely related to the Dover Nathaniel? On the other hand, perhaps it was just a fashionable name between 1665 and 1694?

To further confuse things there was also a John MATSON & Judith MARTIN starting a family in Wye at the same time (maybe a little earlier) as John & Elizabeth. Perhaps as John & Judith started their family before John & Elizabeth it points to the John married to Judith as being the son of William in case 1 above leaving the John married to Elizabeth to be the son of John & Mary in case 2. Even combined with the Nathaniel name coincidence this is pretty tenuous.

<u>1824 Pigot's Directory - Deal</u> Matson ... Miller Alfred Sq Deal Bushell James ...Miller Alfred Sq Deal Alfred Square marks the north end of the "old town" of Deal. It links Middle Street and High Street on the south side, Sandown Road and College Road on the north side. Cavendish House, on the corner of North Street and Sandown Road, was once a bakery. This *may* have been the premises referred to in Pigot's Directory.

It certainly looks as if Mary Hyder is the same person as the Mary Matson in the 1841 census. I had a look at the St Leonard's records in Deal Library looking at the baptisms around 1758-1760 on the basis that at least one of the couple was around twenty years of age at their marriage, but no luck.

Perhaps even more significantly, there was no sign of anyone by the name of Matson or Hyder - one might have thought that at least one sibling from either family might be born around that time - again no luck. So I tried the Independent (Congregational) records on the basis that if they were non-conformists they would have had to marry in an Anglican Church because of Hardwick's Marriage Act, which was then in force. No luck there either. Although there are a few Matsons, and a few more Hyders in the phone book, none are in Deal. There are some Hyders in the Dover/Canterbury area.

The entry for the 1781 marriage shows both parties as being "of this parish", but that doesn't mean too much anyway!

Curling is quite a well-known name in Deal.

There is a record of a Will at Archdeaconry Court 1784-89 119 Book 101 for William Matson Walmer.Will Proved 12th April 1785.

Note: - David Wright's guide to East Kent Parishes notes that St George was formerly a Chapelry to St Leonard's. The St George registers date from 1852 and previous entries are copies of St Leonard registers.

This book states that in 1840 Upper Deal Mill was owned by a widow, Mrs. Matson and that the new smock mill was built for her son. According to a directory of that date, Fred Matson was the miller in 1878, and he held it as late as 1894.

Without dates, the same book refers to George Matson as the miller. It says that this family continued to use it for a great number of years and that Frederick Matson was the miller in 1878 and had it as late as 1894. It was demolished in March 1929, the land being acquired for the construction of dwellings for men employed in Betteshanger Colliery. (Mill Hill Estate).

Mary Ann was the second wife of William Cavell as their marriage licence of 31 Dec 1803 shows him as a widow and her as a spinster.

In 1800, Mary Ann was a witness at the marriage of James HOLMES and Maria BURVILLE in Walmer. Mary Ann's signature is on the marriage entry for James HOLMES and Maria BURVILLE in 1800. She has a flowing hand and was probably literate, so likely to have been middle class, which fits with her being the daughter of a mill owner. James HOLMES was a master plumber, his father a victualler (at the Green Dragon in Dover), and Maria BURVILLE's father was a farmer with land at St Margaret's-at-Cliffe.

Interestingly, two granddaughters (sisters) of James and Maria both married COLLARDs (probably brothers) in 1868 and 1869, but this is probably just coincidence.

The Parish records show that Mary Ann Cavell was aged 41 and buried 11th October 1823. Her address is given as Middle Street, Lower Deal.

At about half-past eight on the evening of Wednesday se'nnight, as Mr Matson, baker, of Walmer, was returning home from Upper Deal, hew was stopped by two men in the dress of marines, armed with pistols and cutlasses, who with horrid imprecations demanded his money: being informed that he had bt two shillings and sixpence about him, and which he gave to them, they immediately proceeded to search his pockets, but not finding any more (one farthing excepted, which they took from him), directed Mr. M. to cross some fiieldsaway from the road, that he might not have an opportunity of making an alarm, until they could get a sufficient distance to prevent detection. Thomas MATSON apprenticed to Thomas RAMMELL of Deal, Baker 1771, fee £12. 15s. (Ref: 67/213 Inland Revenue records at PRO)

There is a Thomas Rammell who was born in Tilmanstone in 1733 and died 1803, also in Tilmanstone. Unfortunately, I have no record of his occupation but it seems likely that there is a link with Thomas Matson. The info I have is that he was the son of Edward Rammell and Margaret Ladd. He was baptised Eastry and died 1725. I don't have a marriage for him.

Mary Ann's (Elizabeth Eve's mother) signature is on the marriage entry for James HOLMES and Maria BURVILLE in 1800. She has a flowing hand and was probably literate, so likely to have been middle class, which fits with the suggestion that she was the daughter of a mill owner. James HOLMES was a master plumber, his father a victualler (at the Green Dragon in Dover), and Maria BURVILLE's father was a farmer with land at St Margaret's-at-Cliffe.

Interestingly, two granddaughters (sisters) of James and Maria both married COLLARDs (probably brothers) in 1868 and 1869, but this is probably just coincidence.

By 1654, Hythe Town accepted the fact that the harbour was disappearing, & impossible to maintain it as a trading port so it was decided to enclose 'innings'. John MATSON of Dover in 1664 was leased 2 acres of the Hythe Harbour, which he was to 'in' (as in Innings) out of the 500 acres of salt and beach, lands owned by Hythe Town. However, the townsmen reserved their rights to continue to catch shrimps & lobsters, and ships could continue to land goods on the beach. John MATSON:

1664 Two acres of Hythe Harbour were leased to John MATSON from Dover - which he was to "in" himself and enclose (500 acres of salt and beach lands belonged to Hythe corporation and as the harbour was drying out the corporation were leasing land to individuals - called "Innings".



I676 The Barons of the Exchequer appointed John with 5 others, the mayor, Captain William Stokes, R.N., Messrs. Giles Dunston, Richard Breton, Walter Braems and James Houseman to 'point out the limits of the Port of Dover seaward, and also the quays and wharves in the Harbour'. They reported that on the 20th January 1676 and on several following days, they went to view the open bays on the coast, and they described the limits of the Port of Dover.

Included in their report is 'John Matson's Quay, which measured on the western side of his warehouse 45 feet'.

"History of the Town and Port of Dover" - Lyon 1813/14, describes John Matson's quay as ".. on the west side of his warehouse, forty-five feet, and from thence, toward the north, thirty-five feet." Note - A subscriber to this publication is recorded as "R. Matson Esq., of Sandwich."

However, the inquiry by the Barons of the Exchequer led to nothing. The state of the harbour went from bad to worse. (p111 & p332) In course of time the private quays came under the control of the Harbour Commissioners/Dover Harbour Board and the road along them became public

The "Annals of Dover" by John Bavington-Jones (1938) -refers to John (naming him "Richard" in error) when it records that at the beginning of January, 1679 John (recorded as Richard) Matson, Edward Dell, Samuel Tavener, Nathaniel Barry, Symon Yorke and Anthony Street were summoned to attend the Privy Council, and were to be reprimanded for attending Conventicles and unlawful meetings. These men who were called..... were all of good standing in Dover. John (recorded as Richard), the Mayor, was a wealthy Dover ship-owner who owned considerable estates in East Kent.

He was clearly a man of character, ability and integrity. From a modest start, he became a successful Merchant,

Ship-owner, and Landowner. He was twice Mayor of Dover; and in 1662 he was described as "one of the rulers of the Town." At the time of John's death, his estate was valued at £11,000, which was a useful figure then, and would be represented by approximately £110,000 at the present time (1962). (Information from Colin Matson). The church of St. James in Dover where John was buried was destroyed during WW2. It has been left as a ruin as a monument. The tombstone lays in the aisle exposed to the elements. The inscription, which I recorded in the 1970's when it was already difficult to read, and which may not therefore be entirely accurate, was "Here lieth the body of John Matson merchant of parish eldest son of John Matson merchant who departed life the 10th NovOctober) Anno Domini 1699 in the 53d yr of age. Also here lieth the body Daniel Matson merch of parish 4th Sonn of the above intered Matson Departed life 15th Sept Anno Domini 1709 age 54 years". Note that the year on the inscription, 1699, is different to that recorded in the parish records, 1686. The dates for Daniel agree however.

As well as a reference to 'Jean Matson', there is this reference to 'Marie' Matson in the French Church of Dover: -'Marie Matson Godmother at christening on the 11th February 1655 of Daniel Paul (born 20th January 1655). Godfather Daniel Portin (father of the child's mother).'

Mary, signed, sealed and delivered her will on the 1st September 1712.

Two of the witnesses were - Philip Yorke, (died 1721) Attorney of Dover (doubtless the man who had drawn up the will) and Philip Yorke (1690-1764) the son of the above Philip. The latter was appointed Recorder of Dover in 1718 and continued to hold this post until his death. At age 29, he was appointed Solicitor-General, Attorney General four years later and Lord High Chancellor of England in 1736. (Information from Colin Matson).

Mary's will went to probate 2nd May 1713 (Prob 11/533).

Sarah BOREMAN daughter-in-law of John MATSON? WATSON buried 1st May 1662 at Sandwich.

The marriage entry is from the Society of Genealogists List obtained in 1982 and may or may not refer to the wife of this particular John Matson. There are several John and Mary Matsons and the ages of the children raise doubts. John and Mary definitely had 10 sons and 2 daughters included in parish records and all those wills.

3: - Another John MATSON somewhere

Various names are repeated on certain of the MATSON lines; Robert and James are core family names. Christopher is important on my line. An oddity is Nathaniel who was one of the rich Dover merchant MATSONs; the only other MATSON with this name that I have seen was one born to my John MATSON & Elizabeth FOADE in 1694. Perhaps this indicates that this John was closely related to the Dover Nathaniel? On the other hand, perhaps it was just a fashionable name between 1665 and 1694?

To further confuse things there was also a John MATSON & Judith MARTIN starting a family in Wye at the same time (maybe a little earlier) as John & Elizabeth. Perhaps as John & Judith started their family before John & Elizabeth it points to the John married to Judith as being the son of William in case 1 above leaving the John married to Elizabeth to be the son of John & Mary in case 2. Even combined with the Nathaniel name coincidence this is pretty tenuous.





He was a bachelor and an eccentric who, under the terms of his will, bequeathed a large portion of his estate to the Warden and Assistants of Dover Harbour. According to an item in the "Dover Express" of November 1906 - "*Mr Henry Matson appears to have played the part of a fine gentleman rather than that of a merchant. He used to walk around the harbour sporting a gold-headed cane, which he greatly valued; and during one of his walks, that precious cane slipped from his hand through a trunnel-hole in one of the planks of the wooden pier and was lost at sea.. This so distressed him that when he made his will soon after he bequeathed to the Harbour and annuity of £150 a year... and a proviso that once a year all the*

trunnel-holes in the planks on the pier should be plugged up, failing which the estates would be lost to the Harbour."

"After the decease of my said Brother Christopher it is my mind and will that my Executors shall purchase or convey the value of 150 pounds pa in Lands unto and in the name of Warden and Assistants of Dover Harbour for the time being for the use and repair of the said Harbour for ever and to be made good from his death until a proper purchase of Lands can be got.

But as I have observed a very great defect in the workmen of Dover Harbour in not stopping the Trunnell holes in the piles of the said Harbour whereby they are worn out and broken asunder in half the time they would otherwise stand I do hereby for the benefitt and service of the said Harbour declare this Legacy to be upon Condition that the Warden and Assistants of Dover Harbour shall upon notice hereof take care to have all the Trunnell holes stopt and constantly kept so and the pins cutt of close and even or else this gift to be void"

My (Colin Matson) interest in this extravagant bequest has led to pleasant friendships with the senior executives of Dover Harbour Board. Henry also made a special bequest of "£40 per annum to be applied for the relief of my Poor Relations of ye name of Matson, whenever they shall be in want of it." This fund has continued to be administered during the subsequent 240 years; and it has been the Writer's (Colin Matson) pleasant privilege to introduce certain deserving cases to The Trustees of the Henry Matson Charity.

There has been a great deal more of family interest in this historic town: some of it is included in 'Domestic Pilgrimage.' and the remainder is noted in the Family Records. Quite apart from that point of view, Dover is a fascinating Town and Port, with its 2,000 years of British History behind it, and its enterprising and energetic present. (Quote from Colin Matson).



The Archbishop of Canterbury ceased to be lord of the manor, and lost his residence here in 1538, when Edward Cranmer exchanged away the manor house and lands, with Henry VIII., for other land, which the king failed to give. So it continued in the hand of the crown until Charles I., in 1630, granted the site called Wingham Court, with the lands belonging to it, unto trustees for the use of the City of London, at the yearly fee farm rent of $\pounds 27$ 6s. 8d., and at the end of this same reign it was conveyed to Sir William Cowper. But the manor itself, with the royalties, profits of courts, etc. remained with the crown, and in 1650 were valued at $\pounds 134$ 4s. 7d.; since which time the right to hold the courts, receive the fines, reliefs, &c. and the privilege of holding the manor courts, has belonged to the Oxenden family, who hold the "manor court" at the present day— (Hasted III).

Lived at Wingham Court and through the Civil War of 1642 -1649. Shown as a Yeoman, Batchelor aged 30 at time of marriage in 1661. Appointed as Constable of Maidstone in 1665.

Charles Dickens writes in "The Pickwick Papers": -

We do not find, from a careful perusal of Mr. Pickwick's notes of the four towns, Stroud, Rochester, Chatham, and Brompton, that his impressions of their appearance differ in any material point from those of other travellers who have gone over the same ground. His general description is easily abridged.

'The principal productions of these towns,' says Mr. Pickwick, 'appear to be soldiers, sailors, Jews, chalk, shrimps, officers, and dockyard men.

The commodities chiefly exposed for sale in the public streets are marine stores, hard-bake, apples, flat-fish, and



oysters. The streets present a lively and animated appearance, occasioned chiefly by the conviviality of the military. An item in "The Henty Journals - a Record of Farming, Whaling and Shipping at Portland Bay 1834 - 1839." records this whaling trip: -

21 May 1839, Tuesday - 8 Whale in, 2 killed by Mansfields part, 1 by Sinclair, 1 by J.Long and 1 by Matson with the spare boat and pick up crew..... Fine day, Wind light from Eastwd.

The Hentys were 1st settlers to Victoria, and were friends of both James and Henry - so which Matson - is uncertain, however it seems most likely to be James Moon Matson as Henry was back in Tasmania at this stage.

"The Times" 13th April 1835 has an item from the "Hampshire Gazette" -

Portsmouth, Saturday, April 11. Promotions and Appointments...Mr Henry Matson. late Mate of the Curlew (for his conduct whilst employed on a particular service on the coast of Africa, in which he displayed great coolness, courage, and decision), to the rank of Lieutenant...

The following item is from "Our Environment", Christchurch City Council's Environmental Newsletter, Issue 31, Winter 2002. : - "The Matson Cottages, situated on Harewood Road and Matson Road, and built by Henry Matson in 1883, are an interesting group of late Victorian workers cottages. Though their survival has had a precarious history in recent years, happily five of the original six are still standing (one was demolished in 1963)... Builder of the cottages, Henry Matson, was born in Kent in 1814 and emigrated with his brother to Australia in 1835. Shipwrecked off Tasmania, he settled there working as a harbour master and investing in two stations and a quarry. Many early Melbourne buildings were built of stone from the quarry. Living between Tasmania and Melbourne for almost 30 years, Matson decided to emigrate to Christchurch in 1862 following the death of his first wife. Here he founded H. Matson and Co, one of the largest stock and station firms at the time. Matson's offices were in the Torlesse building in Cathedral Square designed by Maxwell Bury in 1864 and demolished in 1916. Henry Matson owned property on Harewood Road where he built a dwelling he named Delce. The first dwelling was damaged by fire but the second still stands today.

In 1882, he began the subdivision of Matsons Road, building six identical workers cottages in 1883. Two cottages fronted Harewood Road and four on Matsons Road. Following Matson's death in 1885, his second wife Edith and son Conway Matson inherited the estate. Conway Matson was the builder of the Edwardian Horse Bazaar of 1903 on the corner of Bedford Row, Madras and Lichfield Streets, which is currently (2002) being conserved and restored for a new use.

The cottages are modest but well built with stone piles, timber framing and kauri weatherboards. Between each cottage was a shared well, water tank stand and washhouse.

Today (2002) the cottages remain in reasonably original condition.

Perhaps their survival is due in part to the ownership of the cottages remaining in the Matson family until the 1920s and subsequent ownership tending to remain within families over the past eight decades. Jenny May Director, "Our City"

There seems to be a possible disparity in dates when the wreck of the "George 111" is compared to the report of Henry's promotion in "The Times" of April 1835 (see above) unless Henry was promoted on the day before the wreck.

"GEORGE III 394 tons Convict ship 14.12.1834 dep London 205 convicts, Capt W.H. Moxey. 12.4.1835 Hit rocks (D'Entrecasteaux Channel) Derwent R 133 lost, 161 survivors included Henry Matson, first mate."

Writings in NZ about Henry's part in the disaster state that the "convicts who were unshackled made for the deck and were shot; those who were shackled were drowned" (St Paul's, Papanui Cemetery records).

Don Matson in NZ - from Henry's direct line has a copy of the court proceedings and says that Henry was cleared of any misconduct.

Henry went on to experience character defamation from William Lushington Goodwin - who referred to him as 'tactless aggressive and rude'. Possibly suffering from paranoia William Goodwin had applied for the job taken by Matthew Curling Friend and was bitter as a result - and it seems that Henry got caught by cross fire!

Henry suffered the loss of several children including a teenage daughter, and the sudden death of his wife who was referred to as 'the flower of the crop' (The Wished for Land - John Manifold).

His obituary in the Lyttelton Times 'He was a man of most amiable disposition and was greatly liked and respected by all who knew him.'

The Wreck of the "Isabella"


On The 18th June 1844, the "Isabella" left Melbourne headed for London, England and Leith, Scotland. She was a 422-ton barque under the command of Captain J. F. Hardie. Her journey had started in Sydney and since arriving at Melbourne on the 6th April 1844 had loaded a cargo of wool.

When she left Melbourne there was a strong fair wind and thick weather, which had increased, to a hurricane by 21st June when land was sighted. Captain Hardie mistakenly thought this to be part of the Kent Group of islands and tried to navigate through what he believed to be a well-known channel of those islands. Unfortunately, the land was actually part of Flinders Island and the ship ran aground on a reef of rocks on the morning of 22nd June 1844. All the passengers and crew were able reach shore safely before the ship broke up. After some days they made contact with a party of sealers and a few days later reached the "Flying Fish" which was on the other side of Flinders Island and about to sail for Melbourne. They were all taken aboard the "Flying Fish" and arrived at Melbourne on 2nd July 1844.

On 9th September 1844, the Postmaster, Henry D. Kemp, issued a list of some letters he was holding at the Melbourne Post Office. He said that these letters had been rescued from the wreck of the "Isabella" and would be reforwarded to London in the first direct mail. This list, with addresses abbreviated for privacy reasons, was published in the "Port Phillip Herald" on 17th September 1844 and included MATSON, Robert - Rochester, Kent, England 1844 Henry went with his brother James Matson to Bacchus Marsh

1847 Port Phillips Directory - MATSON Henry - settler, Acheron River, Western Port.

1848-9 Henry Matson sold Acheron and moved to Bullengarooke Station near Bacchus Marsh. (From "Wished For Land")



Alice died in 1861. Henry moved to Christchurch in January 1862 and remarried, on 24th June 1867, at St. Michael's, to a much younger woman, Edith Dearden. They settled on a 29-acre estate in Papanui, 'Delce Farm' towards the Papanui end of Harewood Road and raised a second family.

He built large stock and station firm and auctioneering business. In New Zealand Henry Matson's estate was called 'Delce'.

<u>Ames Triggs</u> was born in Suffolk and, in 1859, arrived on the Clontarf with his wife, Sarah Ann, and family. Triggs bought a farm just west of the railway crossing at Papanui <u>next door to Henry Matson's estate</u>. Delce'. He worked as a dairy farmer and, later, grew fruit trees.

Row F No. 86 Matson

This is a large oblong block with 20 nameplates inserted round the outside edging.

People buried here include the 'grandfathers' of the family, Henry Matson, 71, who died on 24 October 1885, and John Thomas, 80, who died on 1 March 1897.

Henry Matson was born at Delce Farm, Wingham, eastern Kent, the son of Robert Matson. He went to sea and, at 20, was an officer on the George III, a vessel that was to transport 200 convicts and 40 homeless boys to Australia.

Two miles from Tasmania, in a big sea, the ship ran on a submerged and uncharted rock and ripped her bottom. Those convicts who were unshackled made for the deck and were shot; those who were shackled were drowned. There were few survivors, most of these being soldiers and crewmembers.

Henry Matson worked at various jobs on the waterfront at Georgetown, Tasmania, eventually receiving the coveted appointment of harbour master. At last, he could propose marriage to his intended, a Miss Manifold of Kelso, across the Tasman River. She accepted him. When the marriage was celebrated, Henry was 30.

Henry Matson and his wife moved to Victoria with Mrs. Matson's family who were sheep and farming folk. Henry proved himself skilled at buying and selling sheep and, later, dealt in gold.

Mrs. Alice Matson died in 1861; four of the couple's nine children pre-deceased her. In the spring of 1862, the widower, 48, came across to Christchurch and met Charles Torlesse, nephew of Edward Gibbon Wakefield and one of those who had surveyed the settlement for the Canterbury Association. Torlesse thought Matson not one of your keen moneymakers. I believe him to be a good man in every way. We are both agreed to do an honest straightforward business and depend more on faithfulness, diligence and quick dispatch rather than any wonderful shrewdness or business ability.

Thus did Matson and Torlesse establish themselves as real estate agents and sheep importers. Torlesse felt that he must frequently write to his parents in England assuring them that, in the colonies, gentlemen must stoop to occupations such as this that would be beyond the pale at home.

The business started in a wooden building on the western side of Colombo Street between Hereford and Cashel streets. A disastrous fire at the property and the fact that the partners had different temperaments meant that Torlesse moved into the building which had replaced that which had been burnt out, while Matson worked from a stone building (which the business had got Maxwell Bury to design) about where Kiwibank now stands in the south-west corner of Cathedral Square Henry Matson maintained his links with the Manifolds and emphasized that he could import sheep from Australia to order. Torlesse brought to the business his longstanding contacts with the province's pioneering farming fraternity. Eventually Torlesse moved back to England where he died – but not before the firm had become well known.

Henry Matson remained in Christchurch. On 24 June 1867, at St. Michael's, he married a much younger woman, Edith Dearden, settled on a 29 acre estate in Papanui, 'Delce Farm' towards the Papanui end of Harewood Road and raised a second family.

The death certificate records that Henry died of Paralysis and Old Age. It also records that he had been in New Zealand for 20 years at the time of his death. Will dated 5th February 1879.

The "Evening Post" of 1st October 1886 records in the lists of estates of deceased persons in Wellington District that have been finally certified to 30th September, and stamp duty paid on net value - Henry Matson, Canterbury, £4805.

In January 1844, Alice Matson and her children came to stay at Purrumbete, while her husband 'went off looking for country to settle down on'.

Her husband Henry Matson had first gone with his Uncle James Matson to Bacchus Marsh and the first three children, Mary Elizabeth, Henry Manifold and Alice Barnes had been born at Kelso. [Tasmania] A fourth child Robert William had been born in Geelong but sadly had died within a year of his birth, in January 1845. John Thomas was born at Purrumbete in March 1845 "

In 1851, Henry Manifold Matson went to Mr Butterfield's school in Melbourne ... after a while he went to school in Tasmania through his Uncle George Matson who was manager of the Bank of Australia there for something like 30 years.

The Matson stone quarry was started by James (Note: - NOT Henry as stated in the book) Moon Matson Henry Manifold Matson's uncle who wrote - '.... took some land in Bacchus Marsh in 1854 ... My Brother Henry then joined me...'


On the Matson/Manifold/Litster/Thomas family tree J.T.Matson (Henry's son) states: 'My father (Henry Matson).....resigned his appointment under the Tasmanian Government, and on Sept 22, 1838, left for Port Phillip and became one of the early settlers. His brother James preceded him by a few months....' Took over father's Stock Station/Broking business in 1877

John Thomas Matson, son of Henry Matson and his first wife, was born in Victoria on 30 March 1845, and started his working life in the Warnambool branch of the Bank of Australasia. In 1862, he came to Christchurch with his father. Soon after he returned to Australia and, in 1864, married the girl whom he had left behind, Marion or 'Min' Thomas of Oakfield, Pentland Hills, Victoria. After farming in a remote district in partnership with his wife's brother, he returned to Christchurch and joined his father's business. It was John who added an auctioneering branch to the firm. He imported from England an iron store in sections and had it erected in Lichfield Street where bales of wool were collected and displayed. John was a superb salesman and conducted the first wool sale in the province. H. Matson and Co. 'became one of the largest stock and station businesses in the colony'.

In the first decade and a half of the Canterbury Settlement wool was taken by bullock dray to Ferrymead and then, by small craft, over the Sumner Bar and round to Lyttelton where the squatter would enjoy a 'shipboard dinner' as his product was loaded on a London-bound vessel. With the opening of the Lyttelton railway tunnel in 1867, the Matsons introduced wool sales in Christchurch, after which the wool was sent to London at the expense of the buyer rather than the seller.

In 1873, there was a slap-up champagne lunch, after which the Matsons managed the sale, which terminated the Kermode-Moore partnership at Glenmark. Father and son worked together till the former retired in 1879. Henry Matson died on 24 October 1885 'after a most painful illness of long duration'.



The J. T. Matsons had 'Islesworth Farm' on Harewood Road and a fine estate. 'Springfield Farm', on the east side of Papanui Road, St. Albans, in the Innes Road-Murrav Place-Browns Road area. It has been stated that 'Springfield' was the second-to-largest house in Christchurch - 'Holly Lea' in Manchester Street being the largest – and that the 'grounds leading up to the house were immense'.

Marion, the soul of generosity had 40 people to Sunday lunch after church. Sometimes the numbers were so large that the meal had to be eaten in several sittings. Many balls took place at 'Springfield. The Matsons had a large family, 'the three girls ... [having] more than their share of good looks'.

The "Evening Post" of 26th May 1882 has an article revealing another side of life in Papanui. - "Whether it be owing to the International Exhibition or to other causes, Christchurch appears to be infested just now by a gang of ruffians, and it would seem if they were acting under an organised system. A local solicitor was driving into town last week with his wife, when he was set upon and dragged to the ground. The sudden appearance upon the scene of several passers-by however, prevented the completion of further outrage. This attack, it must be said, was done in broad daylight. Several of the residents of Papanui, a suburb of Christchurch, received nightly visitations of the gang, but in each case, the inmates being on the alert, but little plunder was secured or damage done. Among others, the houses of the Hon. J.T. Peacock, Messrs. J. Evans brown and J.T. Matson were singled out. Several cases of sticking-up are also reported, where the sufferers were severely beaten and everything of value torn from them" Humble locals marveled at the wonders of 'Springfield Farm', which included a running track on the land facing Browns Road; the Matson boys were all good runners. Then there were the animals, which included llamas, monkeys, and alpacas. William Barnard Rhodes of Wellington had sent alpacas to his brother, Robert Heaton Rhodes of 'Elmwood' in the hope that they might be farmed for their wool. The experiment did not succeed and Robert was happy to pass them to J. T. Matson. There was much bird life including peacocks, parrots, parakeets and kookaburras.

Another novelty appeared at the Matson properties. In 1886, John read an article in the Australian about the arrival, in Adelaide, of a consignment of South African ostriches. It was intended that the feathers would be used in the manufacture of women's hats and fans. Matson sent a telegram across the Tasman and managed to secure four of the best specimens of the flock. A male was killed on the voyage and a female so badly injured that she too died. The remaining pair survived, thrived and, on 30 December 1886, there were hatched, at Matson's property, the first ostrich chicks to be born anywhere in New Zealand. When the chicks matured, long white feathers were taken from their wings and made into fans. These the Governor presented to Queen Victoria and her daughter-in-law, Princess Alexandra.

Eventually John Matson had 43 birds, some at Harewood Road, some at St. Albans. People came to admire the spectacle of the birds marching solemnly, especially John's prize pair whom he named 'Mr. and Mrs. Gladstone'. They also gawked at other birds, which careered at full speed with outstretched necks. On one occasion tourists returned to Warner's Hotel and, to the amazement of fellow guests who were not in the know toasted 'Success to Mr. Matson and the ostriches'.

Matson's neighbours complained of the male birds becoming temperamental in the mating season. One day there was much commotion when a bird escaped and was trapped only when it reached Sydenham. A groom armed with a pitchfork had to steer the creature home.

The Canterbury times commented:

The credit of introducing ostriches into New Zealand must be given to Mr. John Matson of Christchurch and it is not too much to say that the introduction of such an important industry as that of ostrich farming is deserving of more substantial recognition than the mere mention of the fact in the columns of a newspaper. One has only to inquire at any of the soft goods merchants and note the amount of money that is currently sent out of the country for ostrich feathers to have some conception of the value of these birds as an adjunct to the income of any one who wishes to make a business of feather growing We hope it is only a matter of time – and a short time at that – when ostrich farms will be seen in every province and many hundreds of pounds that are now annually sent away for feathers will be kept here to enrich and reward those who are enterprising enough to follow so bold a leader as the man we have just named.

John Matson supported St. Paul's and, each Sunday, the family coach, complete with livery, would arrive at the front door after breakfast. Marion would step out in the latest fashion and the coach could be seen traveling up Papanui Road to the church.

The "Timaru Herald" of the 1st January 1885 reports that on the 11th December the promoters of the West Coast Railway have appointed a committee to endeavor to arrange for the construction of lines by coming to terms with the Government and then inducing London capitalists to take up the contract. Included in the membership of this committee is J. T. Matson.

The "Tuapeka Times" of the 15th December 1888 has this item - " Mr J.T.Matson says that he invested for a client in England £400 in Christchurch city properties 31 years ago, and since then he has remitted in principal and interest £69,323 and he has over £10,000 yet to realise"

John's health collapsed and, about 1893, he handed the business to his three surviving sons.

The "Wanganui Herald" of 30th October 1894 has this report -

New Plymouth, October 30. Te Whiti has been publicly presented with a handsome Kaiapoi rug on which was woven "Te Whiti, Parihaka, from John T. Matson, Canterbury, 1894". The chief on receiving it said he appreciated the gift because it was pleasant to him to think that Mr Matson's and Te Whiti; s short acquaintance and the humorous reception he gave to the party who visited Parihaka shoul be recognised in such a handsome manner. He accepted the present in the spirit in which it was given. The rug was then put on a young chieftainess' back with the inscription outwards and she promenaded the settlement with it on for the inspection of the natives.

Late in 1894 he fell ill. 'For some little time ... Mr. Matson ... [was] confined to his room with the disease to which he ...succumbed', aged 50, on 15 April 1895. The bells at St. Paul's church rang a muffled peal in his honour and Bishop Churchill Julius took the funeral service.

Will dated 8th December 1894 leaves everything to wife Marion. Witnessed by Alice Barnes Matson, his sister.

The conservative Press commented: For many years Mr. Matson's vigorous personality, push and energy made him well-known, not only in his own immediate locality but all over the colony. He had a wonderful vigour of character and, once he took up a line, he adhered to it with unflinching pertinacity, despite all opposition. Indeed, it seemed that opposition only increased and redoubled his efforts Kindly to a fault ... he will be missed by many. The Lyttelton times, which shared John's world view, stated that the auctioneer

... was a man of large heart and undaunted energy and ... always foremost in assisting in any movement that he conceived to be for the benefit of the colony, often to his own personal disadvantage.

Marion Matson was 'a woman of strong personality and force of character' whose ... influence was felt within a large circle of friends. Her knowledge of the Bible was far above the average and her faith such that made her religion practical.

In her younger day Marion 'was ever in the front in doing all that was in her power to help in the church's work' though 'the infirmities of age' meant that, later, she could not take an active part in church matters. Despite this she was, for over 50 years 'a staunch supporter of St. Paul's, Papanui'.

Marion, 75, died on 23 November 1917.

John Thomas came to New Zealand ' in 1895, to spend his last days amongst his family, all of whom, with the exception of one daughter, are in Canterbury'. Thomas settled into the household of his widowed daughter, Marion Matson.

John Thomas – Jack – Matson, eldest son of John Thomas and Marion Matson, was born in 1865 and was a man of promise. The Lyttelton times wrote that ... at school, at college and ... as an auctioneer for the firm of H. Matson and Co., Jack Matson was admired and respected by all who came in contact with him. In his business career, he showed a more than ordinary fitness for his avocation, into which he threw his whole energy. A cheerful disposition aided him greatly to achieve success as an auctioneer and his good-humoured banter and smart repartee with which he was wont to enliven otherwise dull gatherings did much to make him one of the most popular auctioneers in the district.

Jack, 'the life and soul of the social circle at Papanui', was ably supported by his wife, Louise. Alas, he fell ill with typhoid and, although his 'very large circle of friends' was led to believe that the critical stage of the illness had passed, he died, at 27, on 9 November 1892. He left behind 'a sorrowing young widow, two fatherless children, loving parents and brothers and sisters, to whom ...[he] was a brother in the fullest sense of the term'. About 600 people representing 'every class and ... every age' followed Jack to his last resting place. Immediately behind the hearse came 'the well known gig and horse used by the deceased'. Next came carriages occupied by family members and then friends and 'leading businessmen of Christchurch'. One very handsome wreath bore the inscription 'From his brother salesmen'.

Leicester's school days were broken up by a period of ill health, which necessitated his leaving the Boys' High School in 1883. He was sent to his relatives, the Manifolds, in Australia, and worked as a station hand on Purrumbete, Danedite, and Coomete stations. The former place carried 10,000 head of cattle and 53,000 sheep, and in one year 900 head of fat stock realized at the Ballarat and Melbourne markets £14 10s. per head. Returning with renewed health to Christchurch, he went to Christ's College, to find that his enforced absence was the means of placing him in the lowest form. By close attention, he speedily made up for lost time, and reached the middle fifth before leaving early in 1887, when he joined Matson, Cox and Co., at Ashburton, as a junior. After two years he returned to Christchurch, becoming grain clerk in the business, and continuing in various positions till 1891, when he joined Mr. David Thomas, of Ashburton, as auctioneer and stock manager. This position he held till 1892, when on the death of his eldest brother, he was called on to fill the vacant position in the business of H. Matson and Co.,

then associated with the National Mortgage and Agency Company, Ltd. His was a most difficult task (as the late Mr. Jack Matson was admitted to be the best all-round man in the stock trade in Canterbury), but constant perseverance has brought its usual reward. - The Cyclopedia of New Zealand (Canterbury Provincial District) The "Evening Post" of the 11th December 1889 has this report - Christchurch this day. Gideon Withers, well known in business circles here, and manager for Matson and Co., was found dead in his office early this morning, shot through the heart. Later. Mr Withers' death is a case of deliberate suicide. A letter was found saying that he had taken three bottles of laudanum, and not having any effect, he had shot himself at 6.45 a.m. When found, the body was warm and sitting on a sofa, with the breast bare. Withers had been at his office all night. The "Evening Post" of the 19th March 1913 reports this - Christchurch 18th March. Before the Compensation Court, the action brough by Leicester Matson on behalf of M. Matson and Co., against the Minister for Railways, for £1478 compensation for land taken by the Railway Department at Addington...After evidence the Court.... awarded

the claimant £550 compensation, together with interest on that sum from the date of the proclamation. The "Grey River Argus of Saturday the 11th October 1919 has this report -

"A Press Association message from Christchurch states that the Land Purchase Board has bought from Mt Leicester Matson a farm of 1520 acres adjoining the Hawarden railway station for soldiers. The property is partly dairying land and partly sheep and cropping land. The board will not take possession until March."

He then joined the stock and station agency firm of H Matson and Company, and from 1930, after the death of his father, conducted the business with his brothers. Messrs Jack T Matson and L W Matson. In March of that year, the business was merged with the New Zealand National Mortgage and Agency Company, Ltd., but the identity of the Matson firm was not lost, clients continuing to deal with the firm under the old name, and Mr Matson remained in the business. The firm of H Matson and

Company was built on the personality of the founder and his family successors, and Mr Allan Matson carried on the tradition. - NZ Trotting Calendar 20th December 1957

For 28 years he was connected with trotting, first as an enthusiast and then as the youngest member to be elected to the committee of the New Zealand Metropolitan Trotting Club - that was 20 years ago, after being a steward for eight years - and from then on rising to the club's presidency and the presidency of the New Zealand Trotting Conference. 

The census records confirm that Susanna would have been born about 1778 to 1781.

There is a reference by Colin Matson to William Matson being the child of a Matson Lady. My research has revealed a christening record for 1800 in St. Mary's Church, Dover where a "William" is born to a William Finch and a Susanna whose surname is not recorded.

I can find no christening record for a William Matson born in or around 1800.

The Finch family was near neighbours of the Matsons. William Matson and William Finch had nearby farms at Barham and Alkham. The Will of George Finch of Dover, gent. dated 26th May 1684 (probate 3rd November 1684) refers to "Friend John Matson the younger of Dover".

Born in the reign of George 111. He lived during the Industrial Revolution, the Napoleonic Wars and died during the reign of Queen Victoria.

It's probable that William added the middle name Finch (in the Baptism record of daughter Caroline 1848 and in the Birth Certificate of James 1841) as it was his father's family name.

However a note from Julia Matson (later Searles) says that 'Grandfather believed he was the son of William or Henry Matson who in turn was the son of John Matson the Mayor of Dover' (died in 1752). There is also a letter from Julia in which she says that William may have been born at Buckland or somewhere in the 'Old Pier District' in the Public House called 'The Golden Fleece'. 'The Golden Fleece' was at 56, Snargate Street, Dover and closed in 1870. (1858 List).

Finch was William's Fathers name and the St. Mary's, Dover record (2nd March 1800) of the christening of William son of William Finch and Sussanna, refers to Susanna Matson and the lady unknown referred to by Colin Matson in his research.

Matson was his Mothers name. He was brought up as Matson and added Finch when he was told who his father was.

Tithes for Alkham (1830s/1840s) show William Matson as a tenant farmer of Peter Lane Fector. Also William Finch as Owner Occupier of nearby Malmains Farm.

Soles Court Farm is located near the hamlet of Frogham on the southern edge of the parish of Nonington. One of the oldest settlement sites in Nonington it was once a thriving estate but now just consists of some modern farm buildings.

The old farmhouse, probably late 17th century but with much more ancient origins was demolished in the 1980's having been unoccupied since the late 1950's. Its farmland was amalgamated into the adjoining Frogham Farm. The name Soles derives from the O.E. sol: meaning mud or mire, and in Kentish dialect meant a pond or pool of muddy water. The suffix "sole" is very common in Kentish place names; near to Soles Court are Nethersole and Ropersole. Originally a manor in its own right dating back to pre-Conquest times Soles Court was recorded in the Doomsday Book as follows: *Ansfrid holds Soles (Court) from the bishop (Odo, Bishop of Dover and Bayeaux and Earl of Kent, half brother of William I with whom he later fell out with and who stripped Odo of his lands and titles). It answers for one sulung. Land for... In lordship 2 ploughs; 8 villagers with ½ plough. Value before 1066, 100 shillings; later 20 ahillings; now £6. Aelmer held it from King Edward.*

It was responsible for the internal regulation of local affairs within the manor, and was attended by all those free tenants whose attendance at court was a condition of their tenure, and by customary tenants. Customary tenants held land by an agreement made at the manor court, which was entered on its roll, a 'copy' of which was his regarded as proof of title. The court dealt with such matters as the transfer of land, the organisation of the common fields and meadows, the abatement of nuisances' (defective hedges, blocking of paths, straying beasts, etc) and anything concerning the occupations of the inhabitants, which in most manors we re agricultural. The Steward, who ran the court for the lord, kept a watchful eye over the lord's rights, including rentals, heriots and boon work.



Lucy had her own band in addition to which she earned her living teaching and playing at many people's homes. The 1920s were the era of silent cinema and Dover was to have four cinemas – The

Kings' Hall (later the Gaumont), The Granada, The Odeon and, in the Metropole building, The Plaza (later The Essoldo). Lucy provided piano accompaniment to the films in The Granada and possibly in other cinemas until the 'talkies' arrived.

The family link with cinema was maintained as Lucy's' son-in-law, William (Jack) Searles provided poster display advertising from his business "East Kent Picture Services".

Lucy copyrighted a system for teaching the piano using a series of card overlays. It was sold through Woolworth's as well as other shops.

After her husband died, she lived for a while in Western, Bristol with her brother George.

Lived at a number of Dover addresses including Dour Street, 13 Military Hill, 4a (during1934) then 3b (during 1938) Metropole Flats, Cannon Street, 11 Harold Terrace (destroyed by shellfire), and 34 Farthingloe Road. Throughout her life, Lucy kept a diary of which the section from 1939, up to her last entry, is kept in Dover Museum archives who have also produced a transcript. The diary provides an insight of the daily life of the family during World War 2 in 'Hellfire Corner', as Dover became known. Unfortunately the earlier parts of the diary which included life in Dover during WW1, are now lost.

Lucy owned an oil painting of Henry Tritton Reakes who may have known either her father John, possibly via Waldershare Park or may have had connections to the Matson family. It is also possible that as children of Henry Tritton Reakes were christened at the Zion Chapel where Lucy was married, members of the two families knew each other as members of the congregation. However, Lucy's marriage in 1894 is many years after the record of the Reakes christenings in the period 1814/16. A record of Henry is kept within this computer system but as yet no direct relationship has been found. Julia Kate always thought that Henry was an ancestor.

About the Zion Chapel -

When William III ascended the throne, there were three bodies of non-conformists in Dover, the Baptists, the Society of Friends and the Presbyterian followers of the Rev. John Davies, who had been ejected from St James's Church. They met in part of an old Malthouse in Last Lane.



Zion Chapel on the site of the old Malthouse, at the junction of Last Lane and Queen Street, then came into existence. Apparently the small congregation of Presbyterians that had gathered around Mr. Davis had occupied the old Malthouse on sufferance, and in the year 1703, the year following the death of Mr. Thomas Papillion MP, his son Philip, who was a candidate for the representation of Dover, purchased and leased the old Malthouse to the Presbyterians who transformed it, without much structural alteration, into a chapel.

In 1708, when David Papillion succeeded Philip as Member of Parliament for Dover, he gave them the chapel and helped to improve it. But Presbyterians, being few in Dover, the congregation dwindled, and the chapel was closed from 1769 to 1771.

Then some preachers of the Countess of Huntingdon's Connexion re-opened it, and re-built it, with the exception of the north wall, in 1782. In 1802 the chapel was handed over to the Congregationalists, the Rev. W. Mather being the minister. In 1814 the chapel was re-built and enlarged. When the new church in the High Street opposite the Maison Dieu, was opened on 7 September 1904, Zion Chapel, the original home of the Dover Congregationalists, was disposed of to a Baptist congregation.

In 1923, he is shown as a Fish Merchant on Jacqueline's birth certificate. John, or 'Jack', as he was known, was lent the money to start up the Commercial Artists business (East Kent Poster Service by Lucy Matson (Hills) who also lent him further money. There is a record of a £50 loan given on the 21st December 1935. The business was situated in the Metropole Building, Cannon Street in central Dover where the family also lived in a flat. 1911 census shows single aged 15 a Merchants Clerk in a Fish Business Born Lowestoft, Suffolk. Living with parents at 170, London Road, Lowestoft. 13th July 1915 joined the Royal Naval Air Service. Service number F6481. Served with the 'President 11', at Daedalus - the RNAS Shore base for seaplanes at Lee-On-Solent opened in 1917 and still used until 1996, and the 'Little Chalin' seaplanes at Dover where he was a pilot.

President II and Daedalus were administrative processing shore bases for the RNAS and could cover actual locations from the Shetlands down to France! In the early years of the war, the central registers do not always record the exact location. Unfortunately, the more detailed card index has been weeded.

The Seaplane Service was transferred as part of the Royal Naval Air Service into the newly formed Royal Air Force and John was transferred on the 31st March 1918.



Lived through the Second World War.

Educated at St. Ursula's Convent School, Park Avenue, Dover. Given the additional name of "Bernadette" when 'confirmed' in the church.

Worked in the drapery department of "Hatton's" large store in Biggin Street, Dover and then a sweet shop near to the Town Hall before moving to work in a sweet shop in the Market Square, Dover.

Joined the Land Army and worked on a chicken farm at Shepherdswell for about a year before joining the Women's Auxiliary Air Force. Posted to Lossiemouth in Scotland. In July 1940, when Jacky was just 17 years old, her boy friend 'Bill Beresford, who was a telegrapher, was badly wounded on HMS Boreas when his ship was bombed by Stuka bombers. 'The Times' casualty list 6 August 1940. Includes "Beresford, W. Teleg:" "Teleg" would be an abbreviation for Telegrapher or Telegraphist. He would have been involved with ship's communications as a non-commissioned naval rating. Jacky recalled that when she went to visit "Bill" in hospital in Dover, she was prevented from seeing him by his mother, who said that "Bill " was too badly wounded/disfigured and to see him would cause too much distress. He is recorded dying in the list of the 6th August.

HMS Boreas - June 1940 20th. - Took passage to Dover for detached service with 1st Destroyer Flotilla for Channel convoy defence.

July - Channel deployment in continuation.

25th - Under air attack off Dover during passage to intercept E-Boats with HMS BRILLIANT. Disabled by near misses, which also caused slow flooding aft. After repair proceeded at 17 knots using emergency steering, in a subsequent attack, hit in bridge area by two bombs and badly damaged. 21 fatal casualties and ship taken in tow to Dover.

Excerpt from "Naval Warfare in the English Channel 1939-1945" by Peter C. Smith: - 25th July 1940.

At 16.45, a flotilla of E-boats was seen heading on a westerly course to attack the stragglers of convoy CW8.... The destroyers Boreas and Brilliant along with two MTBs were sailed out, from Dover, to attack the enemy flotilla. ... as the destroyers pressed home their attack, the German shore batteries, thought to be 4-inch calibre, opened fire in their turn upon the British ships... which were ordered to break off the action and retire forthwith, which they did at 1751.....The destroyers were returning to Dover at high speed when about 18.00 hours they were attacked by Ju87 dive bombers. The first wave brought Boreas to a dead stop. The second wave of Stukas achieved a direct hit on HMS Boreas's bridge wing which penetrated the thin plating and exploded in the galley flat, causing many casualties, fifteen men being killed and twenty-nine wounded, some seriously, The effect of this hit was to damage all her boiler room fans and main cooler castings, which meant she was unable to make steam. HMS Brilliant took two bombs in her stern... Eventually tugs had to be sent to tow both destroyers back to Dover.

26th - Repair arranged at commercial shipyard in London.

28th - Tow to Millwall Dock.

30th - Taken in hand for repair.

August to December - Under repair.

RAF Lossiemouth opened in May 1939 with 15 FTS operating Harts, Oxfords and Harvards. In June 1940 the Wellingtons of 20 OTU, which trained thousands of bomber, crews until the end of the war in 1945 replaced the FTS.

Lossiemouth was one of the forward bases used to attack shipping in Norwegian waters. The station also housed 46 MU, which prepared thousands of aircraft for operational use.

Jacky then transferred to Medmenham in Buckinghamshire where she worked in the photographic section developing air reconnaissance photographs including those of the famous 'Dam Busters' raid. RAF Medmenham is a Royal Air Force base near Medmenham, in Buckinghamshire, United Kingdom. RAF Medmenham at Danesfield House was to Imagery Intelligence, what Bletchley Park was to Signals Intelligence. It was once the home of the RAF

Intelligence Branch.

In April 1941, an RAF Photographic interpretation Unit (PIU) moved to Danesfield House, Medmenham, and was renamed the Central Interpretation Unit (CIU) as its previous location at Wembley was short of space. Later that year the Bomber Command Damage Assessment Section was absorbed, and amalgamation was completed when the Night Photographic Interpretation Section of No 3 PRU, Oakington, was



integrated with CIU in February 1942. During 1942 and 1943, the CIU gradually expanded and was concerned in the planning stages of practically every operation of the war, and in every aspect of intelligence. In 1945 daily intake of material averaged 25,000 negatives and 60,000 prints. By 'VE' day the print library, which documented and stored world-wide cover, held 5,000,000 prints from which 40,000 reports had been produced.

The CIU developed the technique and application of interpretation, centralised the extraction of intelligence from air photographs, co-ordinated the knowledge already possessed and was responsible for the dissemination of photographic intelligence by means of reports, detailed maps and plans, models, mosaics and prints to the intelligence departments of the three services. With the entry of the United States into the war, it incorporated some

125 interpreters and 79 other ranks of the U.S.A.A.F. and became a truly inter-Allied Unit. On VE-Day, it had the strength of some 326 R.A.F. and W.R.A.F. interpreters, 1,000 other ranks, as well as 16 officers from the Royal Navy and 76 from the British Army, in addition to the American contribution above mentioned. The strategic American reconnaissance forces were also integrated with 106 Group i.

During WW2 Churchill's daughter Sarah was at RAF Medmenham interpreting aerial photographs in 1943. Constance Babington-Smith, and her colleagues at R.A.F. Medmenham discovered the German rockets in 1943 in recon photographs of Peenemünde"

9.11am train this morning collided with a Motor Car on the Level Crossing at Biddenden Station. The Motor Car when I first saw it, was traveling at a fast speed, and on the Engine Driver whistling again just by the signal. The car belonged to Merchant & Tubb, Outfitters, Maidstone. The occupants were – Geo. Bowles, Driver, Lewis Matson, Herbert John Bowers and Clarence R Cole.

The injuries were as follows:

Geo. Bowles - Fractured skull and was delirious.

Lewis Matson - Scalp wound & back injured.

Herbert John Bowers - Face and knee slightly injured.

(Allowed to go home from hospital)

Clarence R Cole – Nose scratched and hand.

(This man did not go to Maidstone Hospital)

This accident caused a stir. Not least because the car's occupants, although clearly speeding by the standards of the day round a shallow blind bend on the approach to a built up area decided to sue the railway! After appeal, the Railway won the case.

"There is an old-fashioned public house, principally constructed of wood, called the Lord Nelson and used as a common lodging-house, was occupied by a person named George MATSON and he had 11 or 12 lodgers, housekeeper named Ellen SEDGWICK and her niece living in his house....At ten minutes to one the niece discovered the lower of the house being in flames.

. (a long report follows)... the Coroner referred to the very active courageous and humane character of the exertions of Mr PARKS... testimonial to be presented to Mr PARKS...

...at 12. 30 a.m. the 24th inst. Police Sergeant Barton reported that a fire had broken out in "The Lord Nelson" public house St. James Lane occupied by Mr. George Matson. The brigade immediately conveyed the fire escape and apparatus to the spot where the house was found to be in flames from the top to the bottom. The engine was then sent for a good supply of water was instantly procured from the Waterworks and the hose of the fire apparatus was got to work in about ten minutes. On the arrival of the brigade Mr. Joseph Parks had with the assistance of a man named Read rescued seven persons from the roof of the building by means of a ladder obtained from Mr. Middleton, painter, St. James Lane.

A man name unknown fell from the roof while endeavouring to escape from the burning building. He was very severely injured about the head and was conveyed to the Hospital where he died at 4 a.m. A woman named Eliza Clough servant to Mr. Matson was unable to make her escape and perished in the flames. Her remains were recovered about 3 a.m. and conveyed to the Dead House. An inquest was held on the bodies at the "Flying Horse" Inn at 3 p.m. the same day when a verdict of "accidental death" was returned. (excerpt from Dover Fire Brigade report of 27th June 1872)

According to a letter from Julie, he went out to the Klondike to meet both Kate and his "brother" John when the gold rush was on. However there does not appear to be a brother John other than the one recorded as being in business at Dover and who did NOT go to the Yukon.

There were actually two Klondike Kates during the gold rush. The most famous was Kathleen Rockwell aka Klondike Kate. Born in Junction City, Kansas in 1876, Kate began her career as a chorus girl while in her mid-teens. Kate arrived in Dawson City in 1900 and first worked as an entertainer at the Palace Grand. There is some confusion as to whether she stayed on until 1902 or 1904. In any case, during her time here she worked as a variety entertainer and dance hall girl. With her red hair and ability to sing and dance, she was very popular, especially with the miners. Kate soon became involved with Alexander Pantages, the owner of Dawson's Orpheum Theatre (on Front Street). Regrettably, their attachment ended about 1905 in a breach of promise suit (she apparently sued him for \$25,000). Kate left, only to return after a series of broken marriages.

Matson, a Norwegian who had spent the majority of his adult years mining in the Klondike, featured next in Kate's tumultuous life. Stories tell us of Johnny being smitten with her for over thirty years but, being a shy man, took that long to finally tell her about his love for her. In 1931, when the Alaska-Yukon Sourdoughs held a reunion in Portland, Oregon he decided that this was the opportunity to write and remind her of their meeting back at the turn of the century. Then began a strange correspondence which lasted two years and finally led to their marriage in 1933. Johnny Matson died in 1946, and Kate once again remarried after this. Kate continued actively to promote herself and the gold rush legends of which she was a part and had helped to create, until her death in 1957 at age 81. There is an uncle John (brother of the father William).



In 1821 Christening record of daughter Anne Emma, Edward is recorded as 'Captain Royal Engineers'. On the 26th November 1819 (Folio 415) Edward was made a Freeman of Dover by virtue of his marriage to Mary Francis, daughter of James Peter Fector.

Edward entered the Royal Academy, Woolwich, in 1807; and was gazetted as a Second Lieutenant in the Royal Engineers three years later. In 1856, he was placed on retirement with the rank of Major General. During his 46 years of service, he held various appointments in his Corps and at certain Headquarters; and he can be considered to have been a sound Sapper and capable Staff Officer. His last appointment was that of Deputy Adjutant-General at the War Office. His Active Service record included the Peninsular War, 1812-14, the Campaign in America, 1814-15, and the Campaign in the Netherlands, 1815-18. On a tablet at the West Doorway of Rochester Cathedral we can see the name of Lieut E.Matson, as one of those Officers who 'served without casualty' in the Peninsular Campaign. Before it, the Author (Colin Matson) has stood and paid his ready and sincere tribute to Great Grand-uncle Edward. In 1819, Edward was stationed at The Castle, Dover, for the second time; and during this tour of duty, he married Mary Frances, eldest daughter of James Peter Fector, a member of the Banker Firm, Minet and Fector. This lady brought with her a useful dowry, which was the subject of a marriage settlement. These two had issue one son and one daughter, who did not marry, and one daughter Jane, who was married to Lieut-General Sir Henry James (1803-77), a distinguished Officer in the Ordnance Survey Department. There are no descendants of Edward living at the present time - a genealogical fact that is regretted by this family historian. In April 1800, DAPHNE was cruising between St. Kitt's and Tortola. On 16 January 1801, Capt. MATSON observed a schooner escorting some coasters near the shore at Guadeloupe. He detached Lieut. Kenneth MACKENZIE, who was commanding a small sloop employed as tender to DAPHNE, with the boats of CYANE and they brought them all off. "The Times" of September 27th 1830 has this report from the 'Hampshire Telegraph': - Portsmouth, September 25th -His majesty's gun-brig, "Clinker", Lieutenant G.W. Matson, which arrived from the coast of Africa on Monday, left the squadron on that station in perfect health. She sailed from Prince's Island on the 17th of July, and has brought home 12 invalids. Since she has been on the coast she has been very successful, having with her boats, under direction of Mr. W.L.Browne, the master, captured 1,043 slaves, and during that period (four years) has lost only two men by fever, although several have died which had been sent away in prizes.

PORTSMOUTH, September 25.

(From the Hampshire Telegraph.) His Majesty's pun-brig Clinker, Lieutenant G. W. Mat-son, which arrived from the coast of Africa on Monday, left the squadron on that station in perfect health. She sailed from Prince's Island on the 17th of July, and has brought home 12 invalids. The Clinker was ordered home, from the circumstance of the unfitness of her state to encounter the winter gales. Since she has been on the coast she has been very successful, having, with her boats, under the direction of Mr. W. L. Browne, the master, captured 1,043 shares, and during that period (four years) has lost only two men by fever, although several have died who had been sent away in prizes. Of the settlement at Fernando Po, we have still un-invourable accounts. The Athol had recently visited it, and found it still destructive to the health of Europeans. The Clinker on her passage home touched at St. Michael's, where she found the Briton, 46, Captain J. Markland, C. B.; she left, however, with the Clinker. The Undautod, 46, Cap-tain Clifford, C.B., was off Terceira; a sloop from Cork, with provisions, had been detained by the Portuguese blockading provisions, had been detained by the Portuguese blockading squadron off that island.

According to the Naval Record George was promoted: Commander: 22nd October 1830. "The King's Levee" (From the Court Newsman) in "The Times" of Thursday November 4th. 1830, has this entry: -

Yesterday the King held his second Levee, at his Palace in St. James...Among the presentations were the following: -......Commander G.W. Matson on his promotion and return from the coast of Africa, by Viscount Melville. The Wiltshire and Swindon Archives have this document -754/123 1835

There is a St Anne's Westminster parish record. This is the most likely Sarah but cannot be absolutely confirmed. 



"The Times" of Saturday November 27th, 1830 has this item: -

East Kent Special Sessions. Canterbury, Thursday Afternoon: -

The Grand Jury found true bills against Thomas Read, John Marsh, Charles Terry, Thomas Strood and Henry Andrews, They were put to the bar, charged with having assembled and maliciously and willfully broken a threshing machine, belonging to Charles Matson, the execution.

They all pleaded 'not guilty'. The Jury found all the prisoners Guilty. There are upwards of 30 other labourers to be put upon their trials for similar offences; the Court, therefore, have deferred the sentence... until the whole are gone through, which cannot be before this evening at this late hour.

The javelin men from Maidstone are all present to keep order, besides extra officers.

It appeared that the man in the white hat, who has often been alluded to, but in no instance taken, remains, up to the present time, leader of the machine-breakers, This is the fellow who invariably insites the men, and afterwards liquidates any demand the publicans in the village where depredations are committed may have upon the body.

Charles moved to Great Baddow, Essex where he was a farmer at Baddow Park. The marriage record of 1811 shows Charles as born St. Lawrence, Essex. The licence shows him as aged 28. 1841 census shows aged 55 and Farmer.

The 'British Farmer's Magazine' of 1841 records that at the Chelmsford and Essex Agricultural Society's general meeting, cattle show and distribution of prizes to deserving labouresr and servants, held on Friday the 10th December 1842 in Class 111. - Best pen of four long-wool fat sheep, of the same breed, bred by owner, and never having had corn, seed, or cake, £2- second best, £1.1s, the First prize went to Mr C.Matson, Great Baddow, four Kent wethers, not exceeding 32 months old, fed on grass only, bred by owner, his property, always in his possession, and have never been housed; traveled 20 miles in a wagon and 3 miles on foot.





They have capital boats - Whale boats and manage them carefully and well. Our boatmen were all dressed a l'Anglaise, and but for their tattooing, complexions and strange language, might well have done well for a crew of wild Irishmen...' (Pigeon Bay is 16 miles from the Port of Lyttelton.)

1852 returned to New Zealand on the "Egmont" with brother Alfred. 1st August 1853 Block 109 Woodstock Run (sheep station).



Woodstock lay on the north bank of the Waimakariri above View Hill. (The Position of View Hill is shown to the southeast of the Red Circle on the adjacent map). It was bounded by the Waimakariri on the south and west, and by the Harewood Forest on the east and north. George Matson, who afterwards had Mt. Nessing, grazed his sheep on the Hunters Hills. These were the first sheep on the run. Matson built a homestead at the foot of the Hunters Hills. The homestead is close to the

cliffs overlooking the gorge and was a wild, romantic-looking place in the early days. A good deal of the Harewood Forest was included in the run. The Puketeraki Range, at the western end of Woodstock, runs down in spurs to the Waimakariri. The leading spur drops to an open saddle at the source of the Townshend River, by which stray sheep passed between Woodstock and Snowdale.

Woodstock was originally three separate stations. Run 109 was allotted to George Matson on 1st August 1853, and he transferred it to Captain James Row on 5th September 1854.

George was a friend of Dr. Grundy's who also came out in the Steadfast.

C.O.Torlesse Journal 22nd August 1856 says 'Matson and Beard came in afternoon and drafted 596 wether for Beard also 1300 ewes, delivery on Waimak. (This could be Waimakariri)

It appears that he was a brother of A.K.Matson. (George was a brother of Alfred Kingsford.) Ref: Dr. Grundy's Journal. Torlesse Journal

They were shorn before they crossed the Rakaia (River) that is Rakaia River - 1/4 mile wide Alfred Kingsford Matson was a judge of the first sheep show held at Shepherd's Bush Sept. 1859. Alfred and his brother George ran the Runs together after they came back to NZ on the Egmont. Alfred ran them alone after George died. The Runs - had several names - Blue Cliffs, Otaio, Mount Nessing, Matsons - all abound one another. 1861 census Alfred is recorded at Mountnessing aged 32, born about 1829 at Danbury, Essex.

The London Magazine' of January to June 1821, contains an entry under Bankrupts - Matson, R. Barfrestone, Kent, miller. (Lodington, 1, King's-bench-walk, Temple. Commissions of the country.)

'The Racing Calendar for the year 1824' records Mr R. Matson in the list of subscribers in Kent.

The Bankrupt Directory published in 1843, 'Being a complete register of all the Bankrupts with their residences, trade, and dates when they appeared in the London Gazette from December 1820 to April 1843', records 'Matson, Robert, Barfrestone, Kent, miller, March 10, 1821.

In 1832, Robert was involved in a case at the Court of King's Bench.

George Boyd deposited a cheque for £397.11s 6d with the bankers Richard Emmerson, Daniel Hodgson and Charles Emmerson at Sandwich. The cheque had been drawn on the 17th November 1832 by Robert Matson who kept an account with them. When the cheque was presented the managing partner was absent. On his return, he sent a clerk to the residence of Robert Matson to ascertain whether he had paid in any money to the account of the bank (as he sometimes did) at their correspondents in London. The clerk could not find the drawer and in the evening, the bankers gave notice to the plaintiff that the cheque could not be paid. The trial took place at the Kent Summer assizes, 1833 and a verdict was found for the plaintiff (George Boyd) that the bank should honour the cheque. The opinion of the Court states that the plaintiff resides at Littlebourne, in Kent. Robert Matson resides at Wingham, in the same county. The defendants are bankers at Sandwich. On the 17th of November 1832, Robert Matson drew a cheque on the defendants, with whom he then, and for two or three years before, had kept an account. The plaintiff, the payee of the cheque, also kept and account with the defendants; he had for a considerable period employed Robert Matson as his cornfactor, or salesman, and had, before the 17th of November, received Robert Matson's cheques drawn on the defendants. When the cheque was paid to Mr Reader, the bank's cashier and confidential clerk, he knew that Robert Matson was indebted to the bank of upwards of £1700. He also knew that Robert Matson had been frequently permitted to overdraw his account.

On the 20th Mr Hodgson finding no assets had been received to discharge the large amount of cheques drawn by Robert Matson upon the house, determined not to pay them.

Robert Matson, on his getting off the coach at Canterbury (on the 21st) paid one of the holders of the before mentioned cheques £200.

The defendants were found to the judges' judgment. Nonsuit to be entered.

Apparently, he had a terrifying experience near the Cape Horn in Africa when the ship nearly capsized. Francis Edward Matson was a seaman on tall ships.

He visited the property in Masterton, New Zealand on his way to Australia when his ship pulled in to New Zealand - apparently it was a grand home on a grazing property - butler or whatever answers the door and he was told to wait there whilst the master was got (a cousin I think of his father = apparently a titled person according to Agnes who kept trotting this regal connection out every now and then) anyhow he was given short shrift and did not have good memories to hand down.

Then drove trams in Melbourne, Victoria. He bought 320 acres at Carringal, Victoria in 1906 and called it Wingham farm. We (Keryy and Wendy) believe it was bought with family inheritance money. He sold 120 acres in 1914 at 2 pounds per acre.

He married a Margaret Murphy who had been born in Maldon, Victoria (Aus) circa 1875.

Her parents were Edward and Margaret Murphy.

In 1903, the couple lived at 12 Farmer St, Richmond, Melbourne and later at Frankston, Victoria as farmer and "home duties wife" from 1914 through to 1936? By 1924, their farm had become Wingham Park.

Dad (Robert Edward) started out as a farmer on his parents' farm in Frankston. They had 300 acres at first but sold during hard times and had 200 by the time I (Wendy) was born. I think it was the inheritance from Frances Edward Matson's sisters in Wingham who made the purchase possible. I think there were two maiden sisters who never married. Dad worked as a sheep shearer and then did fencing contracts. He liked to work under his own steam. If gravestone listings are anything to go on, then it mentions Francis first followed by Henry, Robert, Edward, John Kent and Agnes Margaret and I would assume that it goes from eldest to youngest. Then we have another Francis (Joseph) born and died in 1917.

My (Kerry Matson) father distinctly remembers an Uncle Frank who we may assume (?) is the one mentioned on Francis E's and Margaret's headstones. He thinks there was some falling out and that headstone Frank became the black sheep and ousted from the family circle. If this assumption is true, we know from Robert's birth date in 1905 that Frank headstone was born before this. If this "Frank" was ousted, would another child be named after the father in 1917?

Robert Matson's children tried for family information but he just would not talk. Therefore, the headstone listings may be compiled by Robert's four daughters and possibly not accurate. I (Kerry) know that Robert's wife and Robert's mother could not tolerate each other and that the Robert Matson family never dined there to the girl's recollection. In addition, Agnes Margaret rejected her mother and it wasn't until Robert's funeral that the four daughters knew of her existence.

The 1917 death listed on the gravestone could be a mistake, Robert Edward talked all the time about his love for little Florence and he would have certainly remembered a child born when he was 13.

The "Southern Daily Cross" of 2nd November 1867 reported the funeral of Colonel Matson and wrote the following -

"Henry entered Sir G. Shiffner's troop of yeomanry cavalry, Lewes, Sussex in 1811; in 1813 was appointed ensign in the East Kent Militia, and served in Ireland with that regiment. Served as lieutenant in the 7th battalion 60th Regiment in Nova Scotia; afterwards in the 3rd battalion in North America for five years; joined the 22nd Regiment in 1823; went with the regiment to Jamaica, and remained there from 1829 to 1837; gazetted captain, 1838; joined the 58th Regiment in 1840' embarked for Sydney in charge of convicts; came from Sydney to New Zealand in command of a detachment in H.M.S. 'North Star', Sir Everard Home, captain, in March 1845. After five years service, during which as Deputy-Assistant- Quartermaster-General, under Colonel Despard, he took an active part in subduing Heke's rebellion in the North. He retired from the army in 1850, after 37 years service. From that date up to the period of his death, he resided at Parnell and displayed much energy of character as Commissioner of Crown Lands under Sir George Grey, as member of the provincial Council during several sessions, and as an active Justice of the Peace.

Isabel married the much older Major Henry Matson who had been born in Wingham, Kent in 1790. Henry was 58 when he married the 20-year-old Isabel.

Maj. Henry Matson who married Isabel de Thierry was a cousin to my (Margaret Fletcher) Henry Alfred (The Canty files called him Kingston!) was mentioned as a cousin - and there was a George Matson who was the Godfather of one of Henry's 2nd family, as well as George Matson a surveyor at Akaroa (near Christchurch NZ) -

1838 'The Times' of 1st December has a notice, issued from the War Office on November 30th - Unattached - Lieutenant Henry Matson from the 22nd Regiment of Foot, to be Captain without purchase.

1845 is recalled by the "Hawera & Normanby Star" in its edition of 26th March 1910, when it recalls the arrival in Auckland of the 58th Regiment (200 men) under Major Matson. Those were stirring times, says the Star, when the City of Auckland consisted of a few straggling buildings, and the inhabitants lived in hourly terror of attack by the famous chief Hone Heke...The troops went to the Bay of Islands, and were engaged in three serious engagements with the Maoris at Okaihau, where they lost forty-two men; at Ohiawai, where 27 were slaughtered in five and a half minutes and at Ruapekapeka, where thirty-seven fell.

Isabella b.1828 was the only daughter of Charles Baron Philip Hippolytus de Thierry, godson of Charles X (King of France, 1824 - 1830), his father had escaped France because of his devotion to the Royal cause, was possibly born in Brussels in Jan 1793. He served with the 23rd Light Dragoons and in 1816 became an attaché to the French Ambassador in London. He studied theology in London in 1918, before studying law.

In 1819, he married Emily Rudge, the eldest daughter of Archdeacon Thomas Rudge of Gloucester. As Thierry had a passion for the South Seas and the adventures of Captain James Cook, they went to New Zealand.

Baron de Thierry made acquaintance with Hongi Hika in the Waikato, New Zealand, in 1820 and arranged to purchase land in New Zealand.

He purchased a block of land in the Hokianga in New Zealand's Far North, in 1822, and approached the Dutch Ambassador in London to try and encourage him to purchase the rights to New Zealand for 50,000 pounds. He expressed a wish to become the "Viceroy of New Zealand" - and in1835 assumed the self appointed title "Sovereign Chief of New Zealand".

In 1835 after spending time in Panama, he sailed to the Marquesas with his family, and proclaimed himself King of Nuhuvika. By this time, Isabella was 7, the Princess of Nuhuvika.

The next year the family stayed in Tahiti while he tried to fulfill his scheme of cutting a canal through the Isthmus of Panama.

By the time, Isabel was 17; her father had settled his family in Auckland, New Zealand and was a music teacher until 1850.

It was during this time that Isabel married the much older Major Henry Matson who had been born in Wingham, Kent in 1790. Henry was 58 when he married the 20-year-old Isabel.

I cannot imagine the personal conflict Baron de Thierry he must have felt when Isabel (his Isabella) a daughter who had been raised to embrace multiculturalism, married the Kentish Army Officer, Major Henry Matson of the 58th Foot Regiment, who fought his friend Hongi Hika in the New Zealand Wars - and my mind is appalled at the cultural shock this young girl would have experienced.

When she was 21, Isabella had a baby girl, Isabel, and she was at last content. Then at 4 months, her little girl died from a cot death at their home at Brookside. The death notice gives no mention of the mother of the baby. The death notice in the Southern Cross 6th November 1849, stated: MATSON. At Brookside, on Saturday morning,

By February 1850, two months after the death of his grand daughter Isabel, and with his two of his sons having already gone to America to the Californian gold fields, de Thierry followed, leaving behind his grieving daughter Isabel, who was said to have turned her face to the wall in depression, with her husband Henry in Parnell in Auckland.

Isabel Matson nee de Thierry died 4 months later. I recall reading that hers was the largest funeral ever seen in Auckland with crested horses pulling the hearse through the main streets of the city as the city's mark of respect and love for Isabel Matson.

The death notice in Southern Cross, 19 March 1850 - MATSON. At Brookside, on Sunday last, after a painful illness, Isabel, the beloved wife of Major Matson, the only daughter of Baron De Thierry, age 22 years, most severely lamented. The friends of the deceased are invited to attend her remains from her late residence, to the place of interment at 2 o'clock on Thursday afternoon. (Nb: Isabel not Isabella)

Brookside, Parnell, Auckland, the home of Maj.Henry and Isabel Matson is the site of the oldest Olive tree in New Zealand, planted in 1848. I also recall a very old pohutukawa - called Matson's pohutukawa at the same site. There were questions about the death of Isabel written as "Mysteries connected with the illness and death of Isabel only daughter of Charles, Baron de Thierry, written by the Baron in 1853, and held by the Auckland City Library, New Zealand.

From memory Isabel Matson's grave was removed from the St Paul's cemetery in the 1970's for the formation of the Khyber Pass off ramp on the Grafton Road motorway in Auckland, yet I cannot find a burial record. I often walked in the cemetery during my lunch break when I worked in Auckland city - there was no plaque put in place when the grave was removed.

Mary requests that '...she be directly interred in the Parish Church of the aforesaid (Worth) near the remains of my late husband and I order and direct that a handsome tablet be put up the said church to the memory of my said husband deceased (added above the line)...
